- b. Support research development, data collection and/or data dissemination on the contribution of sport to development and peace;
- c. Leverage sport events to promote and support sport for sustainable development, climate action, or peace initiatives;
- d. Reinforce the 2030 Agenda and eradicate poverty in times of multiple crises, leading to the effective delivery of sustainable, resilientinnovative solutions; and/or
- e. Safeguard sport from corruption and crime.
