






# Which SDGs are coops addressing?

A study by the WCM on Communication on Progress (CoP) by the Top 300 large cooperatives showed that Cooperatives address All SDGs.


FIGURE 4. SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDGS) ADDRESSED IN THE COPS OF THE TOP 300 ORGANISATIONS THAT ADHERE TO THE UN GLOBAL COMPACT PROJECT.



In the tradition of their founders, cooperative members believe in the ethical values of honesty, openness, social responsibility and caring for others.




