## **Advancing Ageing Policy Formulation and Action Plan in Africa**

The United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA) in collaboration with the International Institute on Ageing INIA (United Nations - Malta) and DOF in Nigeria, is pleased to announce the event titled **Advancing Ageing Policy Formulation and Action Plan in Africa**.

This event, sponsored by the Permanent Missions of Nigeria and Malta to the United Nations in New York, seeks to build momentum for the Second World Social Development Summit in 2025.

INIA has trained over 2,800 participants from 150 countries through its regular and international short- and long-term training programmes held in Malta. Since 1995, INIA has also conducted 151 in-situ training programmes in 30 countries, training more than 5,500 professionals in the field of ageing. In China, for example, INIA has collaborated with various Government organizations to train an additional 5,000 candidates.

This event also celebrates a decade of impactful partnership between INIA and DOF. Initially focused on in-situ training in Nigeria, this collaboration has expanded to establish an INIA Satellite Centre in Sub-Saharan Africa, which now serves 44 countries. The Centre aims to strengthen national and regional capacities to develop transformative policies, planning, and implementation frameworks for ageing programmes across the region.
