1. Poverty trends in Ethiopia







- Guided by ambitious midterm plans
- Strong economic growth average >10%
- Per capita GDP growth 8% and visions MIC by 2025
- Expanded access to social services
- About 70% of public Res on pro-poor
- Low and stable inequality
- Six of the eight MDGs are either achieved or on track
- Improved human development







2. UN Development System support to Ethiopia




- With 29 agencies the UNCT is the largest in the world
- A range of UN operational activities supported poverty reduction
- Rollout and implementation of the SDGs
- Under UNDAF and CPDs contributed to poverty reduction through:
 - ✓ Programmatic activities in capacity building, TA, and knowledge exchange
 - ✓ Catalytic and strategic interventions in policy analytics, advisory and advocacy services and institutional development
 - ✓ Advancing UN normative agenda and human rights

3. Key Challenges to eradicating poverty



- Macroeconomic/External sector (structural problem)
- Resilience (Ag/rural sector, recurring droughts)
- Demographic transition and job creation
- Governance (Economic and political governance)
- Capacity limitations (data, institutional, financial)

4. Role of the UN System to make the Third Decade Effective



- UNDAF2016 2020 aligned to GTP II and CPDs is a gov't and UN tool framed in five clusters
 - Inclusive growth and structural transformation
 - Resilience and green economy
 - Human capital development
 - Good governance and capacity development
 - Equality and empowerment


