We do this through connecting (primarily through the internet) practicing nursing home social workers, scholars, and advocates who work to support quality social work services in nursing homes.

Q3 Information as to the programmes and activities of the organization in areas relevant to the human rights of older persons:

We sponsor webinars (free and open to the public--to date 35--recordings are posted on our website) that focus on emotional, psychosocial, and advocacy concerns that social workers can help residents and families address. We encourage peer support of nursing home social workers through our listserv (400 participants). We support the development of consensus statements that inform proposed federal changes affecting the psychosocial care available to nursing home residents.
