To reverse this trajectory, we must forge a new global consensus, one that unites us behind inclusive and sustainable development, rooted in equity, accountability, and shared prosperity.

### **Excellencies**,

As we prepare to adopt the **Doha Political Declaration**, we must recommit to its central promise: to leave no one behind and place people at the heart of development. The Gambia welcomes this important declaration as a foundation for renewed hope and collective action.

The Gambia continues to prioritize social development, enduring peace, economic empowerment, and poverty eradication. Through policy and institutional reforms, we are strengthening democratic governance, promoting inclusive growth, and expanding opportunities for all, particularly women and youth.

We further welcome the **Sevilla Commitment** emerging from the **Fourth International Conference** on Financing for Development, which calls for reforming the global financing architecture and renewing the spirit of the Addis Ababa Agenda. We urge timely and meaningful political commitment to ensure adequate and predictable financing for development.

**In conclusion**, we enthusiastically support the adoption of the **Doha Political Declaration** and call for its robust implementation, backed by adequate resources. As a Least Developed Country, The Gambia appeals for strengthened international solidarity, climate financing, technology transfer,

and meaningful debt relief to build resilient economies and achieve the 2030 Agenda.

The Gambia reaffirms its commitment to this noble cause. You can count on us to work in the spirit of shared humanity, partnership, and progress.
